We have been so excited over the last couple of months with the energy we see growing in this church.

Here are some things that are going on:

Worship and Coffee Hour: Worship attendance is gradually increasing, and people are staying after worship to chat, plan, and encourage one another. Lent, Holy Week, and Easter were full of meaningful worship experiences. We are planning now for the Pentecost service.

Mission project: Your donations of non-perishables are delivered to the charity of the month. You make a difference for the approximately 2400 people in our county who are hungry. Checks are still accepted for the Food Pantry if you prefer.

Mission project: Being good neighbors and supportive friends to the men and women who serve our community at the jail. If you would like to provide goodies or help deliver treats, contact Robby or Nancy Thompson, chair of Mission and Outreach.

Website and social media: 2 people have submitted prayer requests on our website, 3 SDSU students have been contacted through the SDSU link, and many more interact with our Facebook page. If you see something you like on our Facebook page, share it on *your* page! If you have ideas for the website, contact Donna.

Outreach: Working with the ministerial association, our church served at the ecumenical Lent luncheon, with Robby and Donna preaching. In July, Robby and Donna will be preaching at the worship service at the Arts Festival. Articles sent to the Brookings Register for the Thursday church page, spread the Gospel to the people in our community, many of whom do not have a connection with Christ's church.

Music: Nancy leads the choir in worship twice a month- practicing before church the day the choir sings. Nancy also provides sheet music and recordings ahead of time to help prepare prior to the service. The chch choir is a small group- what is missing? ur! Contact Nancy Ohnstad if you would like to get in on the fun! Contact Donna if you would like to provide special music!

Serving at funerals: Funeral services in our church not only provide comfort to loved ones, they also are an opportunity to encourage them in their faith- often at the time when they most have a need for hope. Serving at funerals-sound, powerpoint, usher, music, and kitchen help- all help to spread the good news.

Exciting things are happening, but it takes persistence for us to continue to make an impact. Talk with Robby, Donna, a member of session, or someone on a committee if you:

- 1. Would like to take a leadership role in an activity- large or small.
- 2. Have ideas about outreach activities- heeding Jesus' call to care for others.
- 3. See something happening in the church and you want to be a part (sound system, powerpoint, building maintenance, quilting, serving coffee, prayer chain, committee...).

God's work CAN be a large effort of one or two people, or it CAN be a small effort from lots of people. However it comes about, it always begins with someone saying "yes"- someone opening their heart to the love and to the call of Jesus Christ.

AED Training on May 5 after Worship led by Bruce Westergaard

AEDs are small portable devices which can deliver an electric shock to a person's heart. This shock can help to stop abnormal electrical impulses in the heart and allow it to return to a normal beating rhythm. The combination of CPR and AED use can literally bring a person back to life! Without early CPR and AED use, only about 2.5% percent of SCA (sudden cardiac arrest) victims survive. But the initiation of early CPR and AED use within minutes, can raise a victim's

Dee Watson honored as Senior Presbyterian

This year's Senior Presbyterian Award goes to Dee Watson, who has faithfully served the church in many capacities over the years. Congratulations, Dee!

Dee was born in Mitchell and grew up on a farm there until his years at South Dakota State College. He graduated in 1950 with a degree in agriculture. In December of that year he married his wife, Lois, who was finishing her nursing training. Since Dee had been drafted, the two married a semester before Lois graduated. "I didn't have to ask her dad for permission, I had to get permission from the nursing supervisor," Dee said.

Dee was stationed in Camp Rucker, Alabama. Once Lois graduated in May, she got on a bus and came down. It was a long bus ride with no air conditioning. "She said she never wanted to do that again!"

Dee served two years in the army, including a stint in Germany. During that time, Lois stayed with her parents in Rapid City, and the couple's first child, Michael, was born. After Dee was discharged, the family moved to Mitchell where they farmed for three years. Their son Curtis was born during that time. In 1957 Dee made a career change and began working for the Soil Conservation Service in Martin, SD. Their daughter Susan was born in Martin. In 1962 the family moved to Tyndall to continue the Soil Conservation work, and there their son Kelly was born. In 1976, Dee moved to Brookings for another Soil Conservation job and the family followed closely behind.

The Watsons first began attending a Presbyterian Church while living in Martin, where in 1960 Dee was named Elder. In Tyndall they tried a Baptist church before returning to the Presbyterian Church. In Brookings, they joined First Presbyterian Church in 1977 "and I've been there ever since."

During his time in the church, Dee has served as Elder, Trustee, Deacon, and on the Worship Committee. He spent time in fellowship with a group called Presby Friends. "Once a month we had a meeting, had some devotions, then we discussed, then we had a little lunch. Kind of the middle aged. We had kids, maybe some had grandkids but most not. There were twenty or so in the group, and I really enjoyed that." He also joined the Men's Brotherhood and was involved with that group for many years.

In addition to serving the church in these many ways, Dee also built some items. There is a mail cubby system still in use in the office, as well as a board designed to hold candle lighters. When the church used nametags, Dee built racks for hanging the nametags.

Dee retired from the Soil Conservation Service in December of 1988. Lois retired from her post as nurse at the student health center at SDSU in May of 1989. Then the two enjoyed traveling, wintering in Fredericksburg, TX, and traveling to Mexico and Canada. Lois passed away in 2020 after the couple celebrated their 69th wedding anniversary. In addition to their four children, Dee is proud to have six grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren.



Men's Brotherhood Notes: MB met Thursday April 18 at 5:30. A delicious meal was prepared by Mike and his fellow chefs. Susan Hugghins presented the program on her work in Oaxaca Mexico with the



Wycliffe Bible Translations. She has been working there for 38 years. She is to be commended for her dedication to bringing the Word of God, the Truth of God to the people there.

What is truth? These were words from Pilate when he was talking with Jesus prior to Jesus' crucifixion.

John 18:37-38a: "You are a king, then!" said Pilate. Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. In fact, the reason I was born and came into the world is to testify to the truth. Everyone on the side of truth listens to me." "What is truth?" retorted Pilate.

Truth can be difficult to discern. I sit on one side of the room and see what is behind you. You sit on the opposite side and see what is behind me. I watch the news on one station and get facts of a matter. You watch the news on another station and get other facts of the matter. We might both get knowledge of something that happened, but do we know everything? Do we each form opinions based on incomplete understanding because we lack all the facts?

This is why taking verses in the Bible incompletely or without an understanding of the context of the verse is so dangerous. It is written in the bible that "there is no God." But read on: Psalm 14:1 "The fool says in his heart, "There is no God." They are corrupt, their deeds are vile; there is no one who does good." We believe that the Bible is inspired by God, and we consider it God's truth, but we must be careful in our quoting and interpretation of the Bible so that we get as complete an understanding as we can on how we should get along with one another and how we should worship God. One way to do this is to read the whole Bible, to see the whole picture of God's word, not just a part of it.
